



NJPEA Year End Rules

Amended January 2010

1. All owners and exhibitors must be current members of PHBA. PHBA members from out of state may join NJPEA for a fee of \$10.00 for adults \$5.00 for youth; payable to the current NJPEA treasurer.
2. All horses must be nominated and fees paid before any points can be accumulated. Nominations may be mailed to the designated person as listed on the nomination form or at the show prior to your first class.
3. Open High Point Halter Division will be divided as follows: Stallion, Gelding, Mare, and Color. The Open High Point Performance Division will be divided as follows: English Performance Horse, Western Performance Horse, Amateur, Novice Amateur and Select Amateur. All horses must participate under at least half of the judges for that year to be eligible for these awards. To be eligible for Division Awards horses must have competed in at least 2 division classes. If classes are combined points will be assigned to their proper age group.
4. Amateur and youth division fee is a per horse and rider team. Each team is considered a separate entry and points are awarded separately. Sale of horse does not void entry. New Owner may nominate as a new entry. Amateur and youth high point division requirements: minimum of four different division classes. Novice and Select High Point Divisions require 2 different division classes.
5. In order for a year-end award in a specific class, you must compete under at least half of judges for that year.
6. Any horse which is sold must be re-nominated by the new owner prior to being shown if the new owner wishes to accumulate points for year-end awards.
7. Halter points on stallions which are gelded will remain as stallion points. Gelding points will be accumulated separately if and when said horse is shown as a gelding. Color points remain accumulated.
8. Awards will be given to nominated horses in any PHBA class which has filled at least 3 (days) in addition to the division championships and reserves. Classes may be combined when deemed necessary.
9. Point system as follows: 1st place-6 pts, 2nd place-5 pts, 3rd place-4 pts, and so on. A sliding scale will be applied in the event there are less than 6 horses in a given class. The horse judged Grand Champion of its sex shall receive two additional points. The Reserve Champion will receive one additional point.
10. Any rule not covered herein shall be referred to the current PHBA rulebook.
